ORDER DENYING APPLICATION FOR A REAL ESTATE LICENSE

The Real Estate Commissioner, in conformity with Section 10152, Division 4, Business and Professions Code of the State of California, required further proof of the honesty and truthfulness of TAJADA O. WELDON (hereinafter "Respondent"), in connection with Respondent's application for a real estate salesperson license filed on or about July 6, 2007, and in relation thereto, filed a Statement of Issues on March 27, 2008.

Said Statement of Issues was properly served on Respondent on or about March 27, 2008.

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On April 7, 2008, a Notice of Defense from Respondent was filed herein within the time prescribed by Section 11506 of the Government Code. The matter was set for hearing at 1:00 PM on May 20, 2008, in the Office of Administrative Hearings, 2349 Gateway Oaks Drive, Suite 200, Sacramento, California. April 8, 2008, a Notice of Hearing stating the date, time, and location of the hearing was served on Respondent at her address of record by first class mail. No appearance having been made by Respondent or by

anyone on her behalf at the noticed time, date, and location of the hearing, and upon evidence of compliance with the provisions of Sections 11506 and 11509 of the Government Code, Respondent's default was entered on May 20, 2008, at 1:25 PM by order of Administrative Law Judge Patricia Connors.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED, pursuant to the authority granted under Section 11520 of the Government Code of the State of California, that the application of TAJADA O. WELDON for a real estate salesperson license is hereby denied.

This Order is effective immediately.

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II

On or about July 6, 2007, Respondent made application to the Department of Real Estate of the State of California (herein "the Department") for a real estate salesperson license.

III

In response to Question 25 of Respondent's application, to wit: "Have you ever been convicted of any violation of law?" Respondent concealed and failed to disclose the convictions described in Paragraphs IV through VIII, below.

IV

On or about October 2, 2002, in the Virginia Beach Circuit Court for the State of Virginia (Case Number GC98004138-01), Respondent was convicted of the crime of Failure To Appear in Violation of Court Order in violation of Virginia Code Section 19.2-128, a misdemeanor and a crime involving moral turpitude which bears a substantial relationship, under Section 2910, Title 10, California Code of Regulations ("the Regulations") to the qualifications, functions or duties of a real estate licensee.

On or about October 2, 2002, in the Virginia Beach
Circuit Court for the State of Virginia (Case Number C98-4139),
Respondent was convicted of the crime of Knowingly
Impeding/Obstructing A Law Enforcement Officer in violation of
Virginia Code Section 46-208(b), a misdemeanor and a crime
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involving moral turpitude which bears a substantial relationship under Section 2910 of the Regulations to the qualifications, functions or duties of a real estate licensee.

VI

On or about October 2, 2002, in the Virginia Beach Circuit Court for the State of Virginia (Case Number C98-4140), Respondent was convicted of the crime of Refusing To Provide Identification To A Police Officer in violation of Virginia Code Section 46-209, a misdemeanor and a crime involving moral turpitude which bears a substantial relationship under Section 2910 of the Regulations to the qualifications, functions or duties of a real estate licensee.

VII

On or about July 8, 2003, in the Virginia Beach Circuit Court for the State of Virginia (Case Number GC03006385-04), Respondent was convicted of the crime of Assault And Battery, a misdemeanor and a crime involving moral turpitude which bears a substantial relationship under Section 2910 of the Regulations to the qualifications, functions or duties of a real estate licensee.

VIII

On or about November 15, 2004, in the Virginia Beach Circuit Court for the State of Virginia (Case Number CR04-3963), Respondent was convicted of the crime of Parental Abduction in violation of Virginia Code Section 18.2-49.1, a misdemeanor and a crime involving moral turpitude which bears a substantial

relationship under Section 2910 of the Regulations to the qualifications, functions or duties of a real estate licensee.

IX

Respondent's failure to disclose criminal convictions, as set forth in Paragraph III, above, constitutes the attempted procurement or procurement of a real estate license by fraud, misrepresentation or deceit and/or by making a material misstatement of fact in said application, which is cause for denial of Respondent's application for a real estate license under Sections 480(c) and 10177(a) of the Code.

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Respondent's criminal convictions, as described in Paragraphs IV through VIII, above, constitute cause for denial of Respondent's application for a real estate license under Sections 480(a) and 10177(b) of the Business and Professions Code.

WHEREFORE, Complainant prays that the above-entitled matter be set for hearing and, upon proof of the charges contained herein, that the Commissioner refuse to authorize the license to Respondent, and for such other and further relief as may be proper in the premises.
