16	The Complainant, Veronica Kilpatrick, a Supervising Special Investigator of the
17	State of California, for cause of Accusation against SHELBIE LYNNE GOMEZ
18	("Respondent"), is informed and alleges as follows:
19	1.
20	The Complainant, Veronica Kilpatrick, acting in her official capacity as a
21	Supervising Special Investigator of the State of California, makes this Accusation against
22	SHELBIE LYNNE GOMEZ.
23	2.
24	All references to the "Code" are to the Real Estate Law, Part 1 of Division 4 of
25	the California Business and Professions Code.

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1 3. 2 Respondent presently has license rights under the Real Estate Law, Part 1 of 3 Division 4 of the Code, as a real estate salesperson. Respondent also has license rights for an 4 individual mortgage loan originator ("MLO") license endorsement. 5 4. Respondent is currently, or at the time of the violations described herein was, 6 7 employed by and authorized to represent M Power Mortgage Inc and Stigler Mortgage, 8 mortgage companies licensed under the Department of Real Estate. 9 5. Respondent violated the National Mortgage Licensing System and Registry 10 11 ("NMLS") student Rules of Conduct by using the services of Danny Yen, doing business as 12 Real Estate Educational Services, to complete Respondent's NMLS-approved online continuing 13 education courses, which constitutes a violation of the licensing requirements of this state and 14 under federal law. Specifically, Respondent used and compensated Real Estate Educational 15 Services to complete a class in 2020 on Respondent's behalf. The course for which Respondent received course credit was completed by Real Estate Educational Services through an Internet 16 17 Protocol ("IP") address associated with Real Estate Educational Services, rather than an IP 18 address associated with Respondent. 19 6. 20 The State Regulatory Registry LLC ("State Regulatory Registry"), which owns 21 and operates the NMLS, administers pre-licensure and continuing education and Uniform State 22 Test protocols. Title V of Public Law 110-289, the Secure and Fair Enforcement for Mortgage 23 Licensing Act of 2008 ("SAFE Act"), requires that state-licensed MLOs complete pre-licensure 24 education courses prior to initial licensure and annual continuing education courses thereafter. 25 (See Code section 10166.06). 26 /// 27 Accusation of Shelbie Lynne Gomez -2-

2	In order to meet pre-licensure education requirements contemplated under the	
3	SAFE Act, state-licensed MLOs must complete 20 hours of NMLS-approved education. Code	
4	section 10166.06(a).	
5	8.	
6	In order to meet continuing education requirements contemplated under the	
7	SAFE Act, state-licensed MLOs must complete eight hours of NMLS-approved education.	
8	Code section 10166.10(a).	
9	9.	
10	Real Estate Educational Services had NMLS course provider number 1405046	
11	and was an NMLS-approved course provider during the years 2017 to 2020.	
12	10.	
13	The NMLS had approved Real Estate Educational Services to offer one	
14	in-person 8-hour "DBO-SAFE Act Comprehensive: Mortgage Continuing Education" course.	
15	11.	
16	Real Estate Educational Services was never approved by the NMLS to offer	
17	online pre-licensure or online continuing education to MLOs.	
18	12.	
19	During all times relevant herein, Real Estate Educational Services had its	
20	primary place of business located at 3643 Adams Street, Carlsbad, California.	
21	13.	
22	During all times relevant herein, Real Estate Educational Services, by and	
23	through Danny Yen, maintained with Danny Yen's Internet Service Provider an IP address	
24	at 76.88.84.139 ("the relevant IP Address"). The relevant IP Address assigned to Danny Yen is	
25	associated with Real Estate Educational Services's business address, 3643 Adams Street,	
26	Carlsbad, California.

2	The Mortgage Testing and Education Board, which was created by the State	
3	Regulatory Registry, has approved "Administrative Action Procedures for S.A.F.E. Testing and	
4	Education Requirements" ("Administrative Action Procedures"), which extends administrative	
5	authority to the Mortgage Testing and Education Board to investigate alleged violations of the	
6	NMLS student Rules of Conduct ("Rules of Conduct").	
7	15.	
8	The Administrative Action Procedures also extends administrative authority to	
9	the Mortgage Testing and Education Board and the State Regulatory Registry to investigate	
10	alleged violations of the NMLS Standards of Conduct ("Standards of Conduct"), which apply to	
11	all NMLS-Approved course providers.	
12	16.	
13	In late 2020, the State Regulatory Registry obtained information concerning	
14	suspicious activity and that that information identified a possible MLO education cheating	
15	scheme coordinated by and implemented through Real Estate Educational Services and its	
16	owners and operators, including Danny Yen. Based on that information, and pursuant to the	
17	Administrative Action Procedures, the State Regulatory Registry initiated an investigation into	
18	the matter.	
19	17.	
20	On or about December 15, 2020, the State Regulatory Registry staff received a	
21	"suspicious relations" report involving suspected individuals completing online	
22	NMLS-approved education courses on behalf of another.	
23	18.	
24	Subsequent State Regulatory Registry research ("State Regulatory Registry	
25	report") found at least 113 education students associated with taking online pre-licensure and	
26	continuing education courses from the relevant IP Address in Carlsbad, California.

1	19.	
2	Respondent was identified in the State Regulatory Registry report as one of the	
3	113 students that had completed pre-licensure or continuing education courses from the	
4	relevant IP Address in Carlsbad, California and who received NMLS course credit.	
5	20.	
6	A Department of Real Estate investigation has determined that the relevant	
7	IP Address belonged to Danny Yen, Real Estate Educational Services' owner and operator, at	
8	the physical address 3643 Adams Street, Carlsbad, California.	
9	21.	
10	Respondent does not reside or work at 3643 Adams Street, Carlsbad, California,	
11	the physical address associated with the relevant IP Address identified by the Department of	
12	Real Estate as belonging to Real Estate Educational Services.	
13	22.	
14	Based upon the results of the State Regulatory Registry report and the relevant	
15	IP Address information, it was determined that Respondent had used the services of Real Estate	
16	Educational Services and compensated Real Estate Educational Services to complete a	
17	continuing education course in 2020, in violation of the Rules of Conduct.	
18	23.	
19	The Rules of Conduct provide in relevant part:	
20	Rules of Conduct 4: I will not divulge my login ID or password or other login	
21	credential(s) to another individual for any online course.	
22	Rules of Conduct 5: I will not seek or attempt to seek outside assistance to	
23	complete the course.	
24	Rules of Conduct 9: I will not engage in any conduct that is dishonest,	
25	fraudulent, or would adversely impact the integrity of the course(s) I am completing and the	
26	conditions for which I am seeking licensure or renewal of licensure.

2	By using the services of another to complete Respondent's continuing education	
3	course, Respondent violated Rules of Conduct 4, 5, and 9, and engaged in conduct that was	
4	dishonest, fraudulent, and that adversely impacted the integrity of the courses he completed and	
5	the conditions and qualifications for which he sought licensure or renewal of licensure.	
6	25.	
7	In violating the Rules of Conduct by using the services of another to complete	
8	his continuing education course, Respondent does not meet the minimum criteria for licensure	
9	under Code section 10166.05(c). The conduct of Respondent, as alleged above, is grounds for	
10	the suspension or revocation of Respondent's license, MLO license endorsement, and license	
11	rights pursuant to the provisions of Code sections 10166.051(b), 10177(a), 10177(d), 10177(g)	
12	and/or 10177(j).	
13	26.	
14	Code section 10106 provides, in pertinent part, that in any order issued in	
15	resolution of a disciplinary proceeding before the Department of Real Estate, the Commissioner	
16	may request the administrative law judge to direct a licensee found to have committed a	
17	violation of this part to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and	
18	enforcement of the case.

6	be pro	oper under other applicable provisions of law.
