On or about August 4, 1999, in the Superior Court for the County of Sacramento, State of California, Respondent was convicted of violating Penal Code Section 470 (Forgery) a crime involving moral turpitude and substantially related to the qualifications, functions and duties of a real estate licensee.

III

The matter described in Paragraph II constitutes cause for denial of Respondent's application for a real estate license under Sections 480(a) and 10177(b) of the California Business and Professions Code.

The Statement of Issues is brought under the provisions of Section 10100, Division 4 of the Business and Professions Code of the State of California and Sections 11500 through 11528 of the Government Code.

WHEREFORE, the Complainant prays that the aboveentitled matter be set for hearing and, upon proof of the charges
contained herein, that the Commissioner refuse to authorize the
issuance of, and deny the issuance of, a real estate salesperson
license to Respondent FRANK H. NEWSOME, and for such other and
further relief as may be proper in the premises.
