

ORDER DENYING APPLICATION FOR A REAL ESTATE LICENSE

The Real Estate Commissioner, in conformity with Section 10152, Division 4, Business and Professions Code of the State of California, required further proof of the honesty and truthfulness of CHARLES RICHARD DIAZ (hereinafter Respondent) in connection with Respondent's application for a real estate salesperson license filed on June 21, 2002, and in relation thereto, filed a Statement of Issues on November 25, 2003.

Said Statement of Issues was properly served on Respondent on or about November 25, 2003. Respondent has, to date, failed to file a Notice of Defense, request a hearing or otherwise establish that he is entitled to the license sought.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED, pursuant to the authority granted under Section 11520 of the Government Code of the State of California, that the application of CHARLES RICHARD DIAZ for a real estate salesperson license is hereby denied.

This Order is effective immediately.



STATEMENT OF ISSUES

Respondent.

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The Complainant, Janice A. Waddell, a Deputy Real Estate Commissioner of the State of California, for Statement of Issues against CHARLES RICHARD DIAZ (Respondent) is informed and alleges in her official capacity as follows:

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On or about June 21, 2002, Respondent applied to the Department of Real Estate of the State of California for a real estate salesperson license with the knowledge and understanding that any license issued as a result of that application would be subject to the conditions of Section 10153.4 of the California Business and Professions Code. 111

ΙI

In response to Question 25 of said application, to wit, "Have you ever been convicted of any violation of law?", Respondent answered "No."

III

On or about August 7, 1974, in the Superior Court of California, County of Los Angeles, Respondent was convicted of violating Penal Code Section 647(f) (Possession of Drugs).

IV

On or about February 2, 1977, in the Superior Court of California, County of Los Angeles, Respondent was convicted of violating Vehicle Code Section 23105(a) (Driving Under the Influence of a Drug).

V

On or about May 12, 1977, in the Superior Court of California, County of Los Angeles, Respondent was convicted of violating Penal Code Section 211 (Robbery).

VI

On or about June 23, 1978, in the Superior Court of California, County of Los Angeles, Respondent was convicted of violating Vehicle Code Section 23105(a) (Driving Under the Influence of a Drug).

VII

Said crimes involve moral turpitude and are substantially related to the qualifications, functions or duties of a real estate licensee.

VIII

Respondent's convictions in the matters referred to in Paragraphs III, IV, V and VI are cause under Sections 480(a)(1) and 10177(b) of the Business and Professions Code for denying Respondent's application for a real estate license.

ΙX

Respondent's failure to reveal the matters set forth in Paragraphs III, IV, V and VI in said application constitutes the attempted procurement of a real estate license by fraud, misrepresentation or deceit, or by making a material misstatement of fact in said application, or by knowingly making a false statement of fact required to be revealed in said application, which failure is cause for denying Respondent's application for a real estate license under Sections 480(c) and 10177(a) of the Business and Professions Code of the State of California.

The Statement of Issues is brought under the provisions of Section 10100, Division 4 of the Business and Professions Code of the State of California and Sections 11500 through 11528 of the Government Code.

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WHEREFORE, the Complainant prays that the aboveentitled matter be set for hearing and, upon proof of the charges
contained herein, that the Commissioner refuse to authorize the
issuance of, and deny the issuance of, a real estate salesperson
license to Respondent CHARLES RICHARD DIAZ and for such other and
further relief as may be proper in the premises.
