ACCUSATION

EDWARD MARTIN POLANCO,

The Complainant, Maria Suarez, a Supervising Special Investigator of the State of California, for cause of Accusation against EDWARD MARTIN POLANCO, a.k.a. Edward Polanco, ("Respondent"), alleges as follows:

1.

The Complainant, Maria Suarez, a Supervising Special Investigator of the State of California, makes this Accusation in her official capacity.

2.

Respondent presently has license rights under the Real Estate Law, Part 1 of Division 4 of the California Business and Professions Code ("Code"), as a real estate salesperson.

Accusation of Edward Martin Polanco

FIRST CAUSE OF ACTION

(CRIMINAL CONVICTION)

3.

On or about April 22, 2014, in the Superior Court of California, County of Los Angeles, Case No. PA074700, Respondent was convicted for violation of California Penal Code Section 487(a) (theft), a misdemeanor. Respondent was placed on probation for 2 years and ordered to pay fines and fees. This conviction bears a substantial relationship under Section 2910, Title 10, Chapter 6, California Code of Regulations to the qualifications, functions or duties of a real estate licensee.

4.

In aggravation, on or about October 31, 2012, in the Superior Court of California, County of Los Angeles, Case No. 2NW01992, Respondent was convicted for violation of California Vehicle Code Section 14601.5(a) (driving while privileges suspended or revoked), a misdemeanor. Respondent was placed on probation for 3 years and ordered to pay fines and fees.

5.

The crime of which Respondent was convicted, as described in Paragraph 3 above, constitutes cause under Sections 490 and 10177(b) of the Code for the suspension or revocation of the license and license rights of Respondent under the Real Estate Law.

SECOND CAUSE OF ACTION

(FAILURE TO DISCLOSE CONVICTION)

In response to Question 13, of Respondent's Salesperson Renewal Application dated March 24, 2015, to wit, "WITHIN THE SIX-YEAR PERIOD PRIOR TO FILING THIS APPLICATION, HAVE YOU EVER BEEN CONVICTED...OF ANY VIOLATION OF THE

Respondent answered "NO" and 1 failed to disclose the conviction described in Paragraph 3 above. 7. 3 4 Respondent's failure to reveal this conviction, as set forth in Paragraph 3 above, 5 in his license renewal application constitutes an attempt to procure or secure a real estate license by fraud, misrepresentation, or deceit, or by making a false statement of material fact in б 7 an application or license renewal, which is grounds for revocation of a license under California Business and Professions Code Sections 498 and 10177(a). 8 9 8. 10 California Business and Professions Code Section 10106, provides, in pertinent part, that in any order issued in resolution of a disciplinary proceeding before the Bureau of 11 Real Estate, the Commissioner may request the administrative law judge to direct a licensee 12 found to have committed a violation of this part to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs 13 14 of the investigation and enforcement of the case. /// 15 16 17 18 19 /// 20 /// 21 22 23 /// 24 25 26 27
